Safety & Protocols

CHECK OPENINGS →



ISOLATION & APPOINTMENT SCHEDULING

– Any dog showing symptoms of RSV will be scheduled during designated low-traffic hours to prevent contact with other pets. A separate entrance and waiting area will be used when possible.



STRICT SANITATION MEASURES

– Grooming stations, tools, and surfaces will be thoroughly disinfected before and after each appointment using veterinary-grade cleaners proven to eliminate viruses. Staff will wear gloves and protective gear to minimize transmission risks.



POST-GROOMING RECOVERY GUIDANCE

– Pet owners will receive aftercare instructions along with recommendations for monitoring symptoms and when to seek veterinary care.
